A Newsletter on Recycling and Solid Waste for Town of Danville Residents

Dear Residents:

We are pleased to report that the amount of solid waste generated by the Town was reduced by 206 tons, a drop of 10% from the previous year. This is a very positive step for the environment, and a positive step towards reducing your taxes.

2007 recycling consisted of 89 tons of commingles and 139 tons of paper for a total of 228 tons that were not deposited into a landfill for a savings of over \$20,000. The Town increased its recycling rate from 7.2% in 2006 to 11.4% in 2007. Please keep up the good work!

Please remember the residents of Danville will continue to receive the following solid waste services:

- Weekly collection of trash with the specialized trash cart
- Bi-weekly curbside recycling (see calendar for collection schedule)
- Collection of bulk items four times per year (see calendar for scheduled dates)

We encourage residents to take full advantage of the services available and urge everyone to recycle as much as possible! The more recycling tonnage we generate reduces the solid waste tonnage that gets deposited into a landfill.

Collection Program Guidelines

- Trash and Recycling must be at curbside by 7:00am on your designated collection day
- Please separate your recyclable materials from your trash by 5 feet if possible so it can be easily identified by the collector
- All trash must be contained in the cart issued by the contractor to be collected. No material (except properly prepared recyclables) left outside the cart will be collected. **Bag all trash to prevent litter**
- Trash carts must be placed at the edge of the roadway with wheels facing away from the street. Do not place your cart within 5 feet of any obstruction... trees, mailboxes, etc.
- No construction materials from renovation projects will be collected
- Recyclable materials are collected every other week on your regular collection day. See calendar to determine collection weeks for recyclables

Safe Use and Care of Cart

- Always keep the lid closed to keep rain, snow, animals out
- Do not place any unacceptable materials in the cart such as paint, solvents, hot ashes, sand, rocks etc.
- Use the handle provided to move the cart. Tilt cart on wheels and roll. Remember to pull the cart uphill and push the cart downhill
- Remove your cart as soon as possible after collection to maintain appearance of the neighborhood
- To clean, simply rinse with water from time to time and let dry in the sunlight with the lid open

Problem With Your Cart?

The cart is a durable plastic cart that when used properly will provide years of maintenance free use. Should a problem occur (broken wheel, lid etc.) please contact Waste Management at 800-847-5303 to request a repair.

HOW TO PREPARE COMMINGLED CONTAINERS FOR COLLECTION

Please!

- All containers must be rinsed and free of all contaminants.
- Any removable corks, tops, rings, metal bottleneck wraps should be discarded with the trash prior to recycling.
- Flatten containers whenever possible to allow for more room in your recycling container and the recycling truck




HOW TO PREPARE MIXED PAPER FOR COLLECTION

- Remove All Plastic Bags
- Remove any Non-Acceptable items and discard with your regular trash.
- Place *Mixed Papers* in any Brown Paper Bag, or bundle with string. Then place "bagged" papers on top of your "Commingled Containers" and set out by 7:00 am on your collection day. You can also use a separate recycling bin for your paper
- Check the weather forecast for high winds or rain and keep your recyclables in for another week or locate the nearest recycling center to drop off your recyclables.
- **Keep your paper separate from the cans, plastics and glass.**

Danville 2008/2009 Curbside Recycling Collection Calendar

Recycling in Danville is collected at your curb every other week. Your trash collection is every week. The Collection days for Danville are Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday. Place your Trash and Mixed Paper and Commingled Containers at the curb by 7:00 AM. The recycling collection will be on the **Green Weeks** as follows.

2008 / 2009 BULKY WASTE COLLECTION SCHEDULE

- Bulky Waste Curbside Specifications.
- All Waste must be placed at curbside for collection by 7:00 am.

Acceptable Items: (not limited to the following):

- Mattresses
- Bureaus
- Prepared Construction debris (as follows):
 - Not to exceed fifty pound bundles or barrels
 - Not to exceed five feet in length
 - No "piles" of construction debris will be collected
- Couches
- Carpets (rolled, folded and tied not exceeding fifty pounds)
- Chairs
- Desks
- Large Children's Toys

Appliances (FEE REQUIRED, by appointment only) (not limited to the following):

Call Waste Management at 800-847-5303 to schedule an appointment to remove your large metal items during the Bulky Waste Collection. Or call us to schedule a delivery of a roll-off container to remove large quantities of Construction Debris and Bulky Items (non-metal) if the Bulky Collection is inconvenient for scheduling your waste removal.

Effective January 1, 2008, the State of New Hampshire passed legislation which bans the disposal of mercury-added products at landfills, transfer stations, or incinerators. This ban applies to business and homeowners alike with no exceptions

Items which may NOT be collected in the solid waste stream include: TV's, electronics any product that contains added mercury, fluorescent light tubes, compact fluorescent bulbs, thermometers, thermostats, electrical switches, mercury button cell batteries, etc.

Homeowners should check with municipal offices for acceptance of these items at local solid waste facilities or household hazardous waste (HHW) collection days.

Mercury-containing lamp tubes and bulbs, and several other wastes, can be managed appropriately through Waste Management's LampTracker recycling program: visit <http://www.wmlamptracker.com> or call 800-664-1434 for more information. TV's and electronics may be collected in accordance with the bulk item regulations above.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

❖ HOW DOES THE PROGRAM WORK? ❖

Each container has been assigned to a single household address and has an imprinted serial number for identification purposes. The cart remains the property of the contractor and will be maintained and replaced at no cost to the resident except for damage due to negligence or abuse. Residents will be required to pay for replacement of any container if the damage is due to their negligence or abuse. **PLEASE DO NOT TAKE THE CONTAINER WITH YOU WHEN YOU MOVE.**

By 7:00 am on your normally scheduled day for refuse collection, place all refuse in the automated wheeled cart and place the cart no more than 3 feet away from the curb, road edge and at least 5 feet away from other containers (recycling bins) or structures (mailboxes etc.). Only refuse placed in the automated wheeled cart will be collected. **No material left outside the cart will be collected.**

The truck's lifting arm needs 5 feet on either side of the rolling cart to wrap around the container. Do not place carts behind parked cars or other obstructions. The automated truck-lifting arm is not able to reach behind trees or other objects.

Place the cart away from low phone or electrical wires, low hanging tree branches or other overhead obstructions. A twelve foot vertical clearance is necessary for the truck's lifting arm to elevate the cart.

All refuse must fit in the container so that the lid is closed. No material may be sticking out of the container.

Be sure the arrows on the lid are pointing towards the street and the hinges face away from the street. This allows the lid to open fully when the cart is tipped over above the truck bay. If the hinge faces the wrong way, the lid or hinges may be damaged.

Recyclables will continue to be collected on your normal day when placed in the recycling bin provided for this purpose. Please keep your recycling bin at least 5' away from the trash cart.

Bulky waste and scrap metal will still be collected periodically during special designated collections. Watch for the annual newsletter for the collection dates and procedures.

❖ WHAT KIND OF REFUSE MAY BE PUT OUT IN THE CONTAINERS? ❖

All regular household refuse can be placed in the containers provided. Residents are responsible for keeping their containers clean.

Items that **CANNOT** BE PLACED IN THE CONTAINER INCLUDE:

- Dirt, sod, concrete or rock
- Construction/demolition debris
- Recyclables
- Household hazardous waste, animal wastes
- Hot ashes or flammable materials such as oil, gas or paint
- Leaves and Grass Clippings(per NH, DES)

❖ DO I HAVE TO BAG MY TRASH? ❖

Yes, residents are strongly encouraged to bag their refuse prior to placement in the container to keep the container clean and sanitary, and to help prevent litter on windy days.

❖ I'M CLEANING OUT THE GARAGE AND HAVE A LOT OF REFUSE TO GET RID OF RIGHT AWAY. WHERE CAN I DISPOSE OF IT? ❖

The automated refuse collection program is not intended to provide this type of service. The resident must be responsible for the disposal. Residents may take advantage of the scheduled bulky item collections days listed in the calendar or set up an appointment for the collection of appliances and electronics. For larger projects Waste Management can also provide temporary containers of varying sizes for your needs (You will find a coupon for these services at the end of this flyer).

❖ I HAVE MORE TRASH THAN CAN FIT IN THE LARGE CART. CAN I GET A SECOND CART? ❖

Are you recycling everything possible? Recycling materials will give you more room in your trash cart. Experience has shown that the 64-gallon cart is adequate for most homes and the 96-gallon cart is being offered for those with larger families. If you still have too much trash for one cart, then you can request a second cart. You will be responsible to pay an annual fee of \$240.00 in advance. You can contact Town Hall to request an additional cart.

❖ I SELECTED THE 64-GALLON CART INITIALLY, BUT FIND I NEED THE LARGER 96-GALLON CART. CAN I CHANGE? ❖

If you have to change cart size after the initial distribution, you will be responsible to pay Waste Management a \$50.00 exchange fee. We encourage you to recycle all materials collected before changing to a larger cart.

❖ MAY I CONTINUE TO USE MY OLD CANS? ❖

The new automated truck will pick up **ONLY** the new containers; your old refuse cans **cannot** be used to put out refuse for regular weekly collection.

❖ WHAT DO I DO WITH MY OLD CANS? ❖

You have the option of utilizing your personal cans for storage or garden use. Please **do not** use these for setting recyclable materials out for collection.

❖ WHAT ABOUT STREET PARKING ON COLLECTION DAY? ❖

So that the collection truck can easily approach the container, we ask that you do not park at the curb on collection days.

❖ WHAT IF MY CONTAINER IS STOLEN OR DAMAGED? ❖

Each household received one specialized container when the new system began. You are responsible for the security of the container. In the event of damage caused by the contractor or normal wear, Waste Management will replace the container free of charge. Damages resulting from negligence or abuse by the resident will be the responsibility of the resident.

❖ WHAT HAPPENS WHEN I MOVE? ❖

You must leave your container for the use of the new owner. Containers remain the property of the contractor and are assigned to each street address by means of a unique serial number imprinted on each container.

❖ DO WE STILL HAVE CURBSIDE RECYCLING SERVICES? ❖

Absolutely! All residents are urged to recycle all materials collected under our curbside recycling program. Recyclables will continue to be collected every other week on your regular collection day.

❖ I HAVE MORE RECYCLABLE MATERIAL THAN ONE BIN CAN HOLD. WHAT DO I DO? ❖

You can purchase an additional recycling bin for \$7.00 at Town Hall or you can use a rigid container of similar size and shape, not exceeding 18 gallons to store and set out your recyclable materials.
